

## CHINESE CANADIAN PHYSIOTHERAPISTS' ASSOCIATION (CCPTA) ANNUAL REPORT 2006 – 2007

The Chinese Canadian Physiotherapists' Association (CCPTA) continues to be an active Section of the Federation of Chinese Canadian Professionals (FCCP). 3. Premier Mixed, Final H races: FCCP Dragons, 2nd place (time 2:22.85);
4. Premier Mixed, Final R races: FCCP Warriors, 1st place (time 2:35.93).
